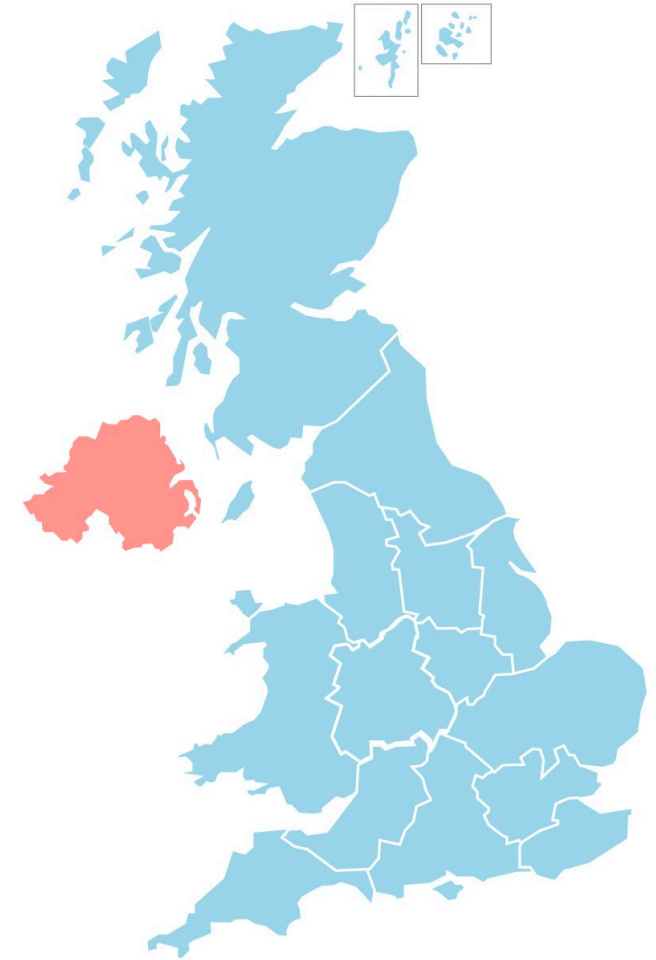

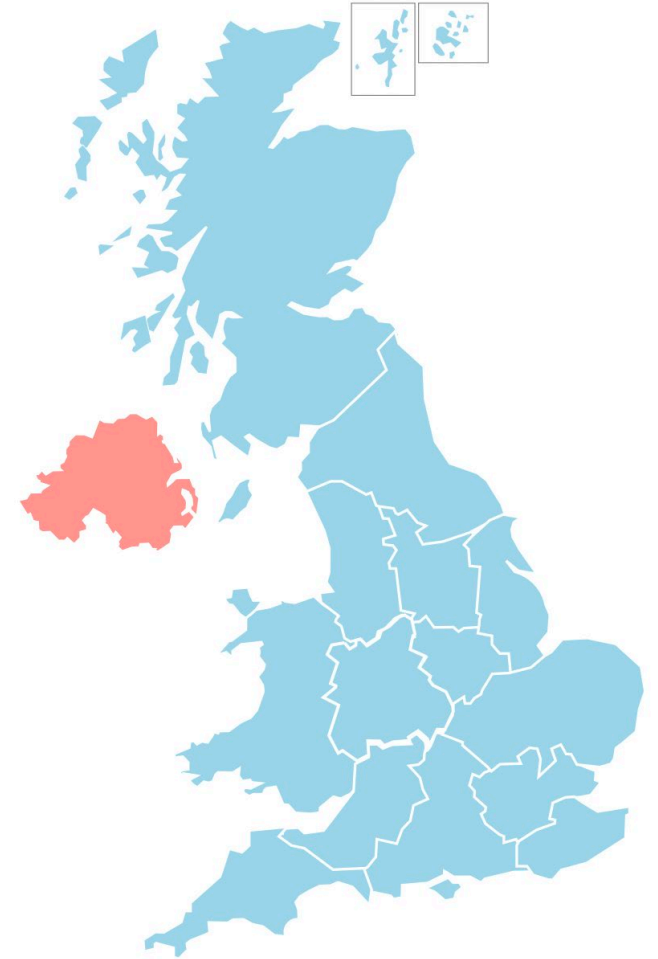

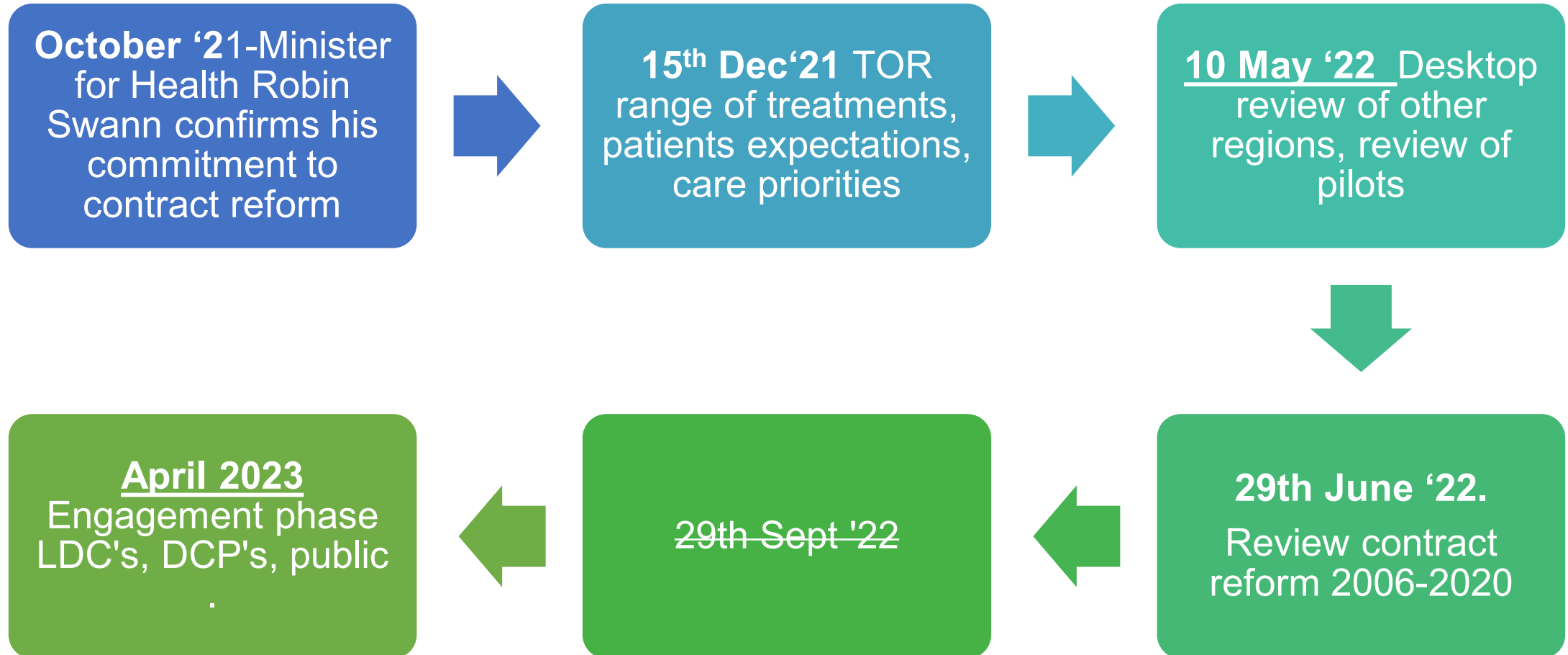

Engagement phase: current issues

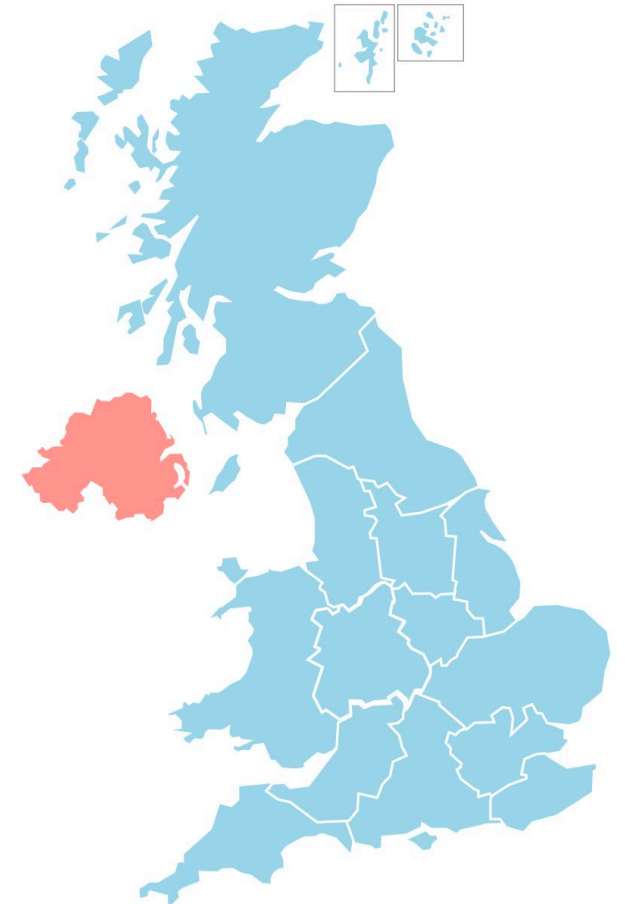
